The key decisions taken by the Commission includes 2 letters of formal notice, 35 reasoned opinions and 6 referrals to the Court of Justice. | Decentralized management of EU funds | <p>Support for SMEs and investment platforms are key to implement the European Fund for Strategic Investment at local level</p> <p>The European Fund for Strategic Investments (EFSI) is benefitting regional economies and communities mostly through massive support for small and medium enterprises (SMEs) and thanks to the first investment platforms involving local actors. This was the main message delivered by the Vice-President of the European Commission Jyrki Katainen to local leaders during the debate promoted on 22 April by the European Committee of the Regions' (CoR) commission for economic policy (ECON) to assess the EFSI impact at regional level.</p> <p>http://cor.europa.eu/en/news/Pages/efsi_structured_dialogue_katainen.aspx</p> <p>Use crowdfunding and EFSI financing to ensure high speed broadband coverage in rural areas</p> <p>Reaching the 2020 European Union targets for broadband coverage in rural and remote areas requires innovative ways of financing to bridge the estimated funding gap of at least 13 billion euros, according to a study presented at the European Committee of the Regions (CoR) on 20 April. The study commissioned by CoR's Commission for Social Policy, Education, Employment, Research and Culture (SEDEC) focuses on obstacles that broadband deployment initiatives often face in rural, remote or sparsely populated areas, which are unattractive for private investors. Recognizing rights of domestic workers and carers in the EU

Domestic workers and carers, most of whom are migrant women, should be given an official status in the EU. Recognizing their work as "real" jobs would discourage exploitation, forced labour and human trafficking, say MEPs in a resolution voted. MEPs recommend establishing easy-to-manage models for legal employer-worker relationships, citing examples in Belgium and France, to end precariousness and undeclared domestic work.

Local leaders have given consumers a push to be at the heart of the new energy market in Europe. Facilitating access to information through ICT, developing a standard, detailed and easily understandable energy bill across Europe, protecting consumers against abusive practices and setting up price safeguards are amongst the key proposals adopted today in Brussels by EU's Assembly of regional and local authorities. European consumers' energy costs have consistently climbed over the past years. Electricity prices raised an annual average of 4% in households and 3.5% in industry between 2008 and 2012, according to Eurostat.
