Abstract: The paper analyzes the normative legal framework of public administration in the Republic of Kazakhstan. Therefore, it centers on the research question: "How has the sequential implementation of international legal norms influenced the evolution of the legal regulation of public administration in Kazakhstan, and what are the key factors differentiating the Kazakhstani model from post-crisis development experiences in other countries?"

The methodology of the paper consists of a comprehensive review of existing literature on the legal regulation of public administration, the implementation of international legal norms, and the impact of common country development strategies. Secondly, it employs a documentary analysis of secondary sources, relevant state planning documents, legal frameworks, and country development strategies that have shaped the normative basis of public administration in Kazakhstan to identify key milestones and changes in the legal landscape.

The empirical part includes semi-structured expert interviews with key stakeholders involved in the development and implementation of public administration policies in Kazakhstan to gather insights from government officials and legal experts on the effectiveness of legal regulations.

The combination of these methodologies will provide a comprehensive understanding of the legal regulation of public administration in Kazakhstan as a case study, including its evolution and the distinctive features that set it apart from post-crisis development experiences in other countries.
