The educational value in higher education of FSPAC Living Lab

Abstract: Due to the increase in the number and complexity of the challenges faced by our communities, higher education institutions are increasingly looking for ways in which to explore the Third Mission of education, addressing societal and economic challenges by making use of their knowledge and output capabilities as well as look for new educational tools in order improve the quality of education as well as the of the research.
